This distinct species may be known from all its allies by having distally to the scent-area of the hindwing a further long, narrow androconial patch composed of yellowish white, unusually large scales, growing out in the shape of a club from the central cavity of the scent-area, which is filled with similar scales, and only partially covered by the anal tuft of scent-hairs. The strongly glossy friction-patch on the underside of the forewing contains a very large oval hollow at the submedian, filled up with brown scales, which varies in size in the separate local forms, but is always somewhat larger than in *minus* *L. horsfieldi* stands in all the
