

DIOPTIDÆ*.

HYRMINA, *Walker*.

Hyrmina trailii, n. sp. (Plate XIX. fig. 9.)

Resembles *Leucothyris astrea* and is nearly allied to *Hyrmina cyma*, from which it chiefly differs in the absence of the subcostal orange spot in primaries and the different form of the subapical hyaline streak. Wings hyaline, black-veined; primaries with the borders black-brown; two oblique brown bands, the first across the middle of the wing, the second (broader) towards apex: secondaries with costa brown; outer margin black-brown, enclosing a well-defined submarginal orange streak. Body brown; abdomen with a dorsal whitish line; venter whitish. Expanse of wings 1 inch 6 lines.

Forest behind Manaos, Amazons, August 26, 1874 (*J. W. H. Trail*).

I have named this interesting little species after its discoverer.
