and one in cellule 6. The species of the fifth subgroup, however, differ from those of the preceding one in having the basal part of the forewing above either with dense, long hairs or with distinct pencils.

M. vulgaris Btlr. (27 g). \circlearrowleft : wings above dark brown, tinged with grey at the apex of the forewing; vulgaris. the forewing with long hairs in the cell and in the basal part of cellule 1b; vein 1 near the base distinctly curved anteriorly and at the posterior side with an elongate, distally pointed mealy spot, which is almost Aurivillius entirely covered by the hairs of cellule 1b; the under surface is finely striated and irrorated with brown, in Seitz with darker basal area, the median line almost regularly angled or undulate; the eye-spots, two on the forewing and seven on the hindwing, are in the dry-season form all or some of them punctiform, in the rainy-season form, tolosa Plötz, although never large, yet fully developed. Sierra Leone to Angola and Uganda. tolosa.
